Saturday, September 22

Shopping on the Church Street Marketplace: The historic, award-winning Church Street Marketplace is nestled in heart of downtown Burlington, Vermont. With nearly 100 retail shops, restaurants and street vendors, the Church Street Marketplace is a popular destination. Visitors include it on their list of places to go, making the Marketplace the fifth most popular tourist attraction in Vermont.

Tour —Vt. Teddy Bear Company Factory: The Vermont Teddy Bear Company is the largest maker of hand-crafted, American-made Teddy Bears! Embraced by the Green Mountains, Lake Champlain and the Adirondacks, the Vermont Teddy Bear Factory colors the countryside in beautiful Shelburne, Vermont.

Vermont Wildflower Farm/American Meadows (combined with Vt. Teddy Bear factory tour): Founded in 1981 as The Vermont Wildflower Farm in Charlotte, VT, American Meadows has grown into one of the largest and most respected suppliers of flower seed in North America. They currently service virtually all facets of the trade, from large-scale commercial customers, states and other municipalities to stores, garden centers, and individual home gardeners all over North America.

Monday, September 24

Shelburne Farms: Shelburne Farms was created in 1886 by William Seward and Lila Vanderbilt Webb as a model agricultural estate. It was founded as an educational nonprofit in 1972. Shelburne Farms is a membership-supported, nonprofit environmental education center and national historic site on the shores of Lake Champlain in Shelburne, where visitors may enjoy the walking trails, children's farmyard, inn, restaurant, property tours and special events.

Tuesday, September 25

Hike on Camel's Hump: In the northern half of Vermont's Green Mountains, Camel's Hump (elevation: 4,083 ft.) is easily recognized by its unique double-humped profile. A day-long hike on one of Vermont's best known landmarks. (You should bring a small backpack if you choose this activity).

Shelburne Museum: Visitors will discover 37 buildings that are home to vast collections of fine and decorative arts, paintings, folk sculpture, weathervanes, decoys, quilts, toys, dolls, circus memorabilia and more. Even the buildings are historic, with traditional New England structures dotting the Museum's beautifully landscaped 45 acres.
