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I. Grant Program Overview

The National Association of State Departments of Agriculture (NASDA) Foundation has been awarded \$3 million in cooperative agreement funding to help underserved farmers improve water quality, habitat resilience and information exchange to benefit the ecosystems within the Gulf of Mexico Watershed. This grant was awarded by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Gulf of Mexico Division. The NASDA Foundation will award sub-grants to recipients in the Ohio-Tennessee Region to provide technical assistance to underserved farmers on how to protect and improve water quality and habitat while also providing benefits for climate mitigation and adaptation. The funds will also be used to implement programs to prevent or reduce water pollution. The duration of sub-award projects will be 1-3 years (with the possibility of 5-month no-cost extensions if needed).

Knowing that resources are limited for all partners, we have worked diligently to design application, funding, and reporting systems that are streamlined and simple. Applicants to the NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program can expect a simple, two-phase application process with streamlined reporting requirements.

GRANT PROGRAM OBJECTIVES AND GOALS

The following are overarching objectives for the NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program:

- 1. Improve adoption of resilient and sustainable practices using novel or innovative techniques, methods, or approaches;
- 2. Increase collaboration, including within and among farming communities;
- Demonstrate the results of the applied technique(s), method(s) or approach(es) through data collection and analysis; and
- 4. Effectively communicate project results to the farming community to inform future farm management and to better understand the most cost-effective and sustainable farming approaches.

In addition, NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program sub-awardees will work with underserved farmers to meet the following goals:

- 1. Provide technical assistance to protect and improve water quality and habitat, and
- 2. Implement programs to prevent or reduce nonpoint source pollution, including nutrients and plastic pollution.

EPA'S FY 2022-2026 STRATEGIC PLAN

Goal 5, Objective 5.2, Protect and Restore Waterbodies and Watersheds:

Projects should also be targeted to help meet Goal 5, Objective 5.2 of EPA'S FY 2022-2026 STRATEGIC PLAN: "By September 30, 2026, increase by an additional 41,000 square miles the area of watersheds with surface water meeting standards that previously did not meet standards from the July 7, 2021 baseline."

ENVIRONMENTAL OUTPUT AND OUTCOMES, AND PROJECT PERFORMANCE MEASURES

EPA requires that NASDA Foundation sub-awardee grant applicants and recipients adequately describe environmental outputs and outcomes to be achieved under assistance agreements (see EPA Order 5700.7A1, Environmental Results under Assistance Agreements, https://www.epa.gov/grants/epa-order-57007a1-epas-policy-environmental-results-under-epa-assistance-agreements for details). Applicants must include specific statements describing the environmental results of the proposed project in terms of well-defined outputs and, to the maximum extent practicable, well-defined outcomes that will demonstrate how the project will contribute to the objectives and goals described above.

The following specific Outputs and Outcomes are required to be met by projects funded through this grant program. Applicants who are invited to submit a full application must include at least **one** of the following Outputs, at least **one** of the following Outcomes, and must **describe the Performance Measures** that will be used to measure the success of the project.

Outputs

Environmental outputs (or deliverables) refer to an environmental activity, effort, and/or associated work product related to an environmental goal or objective that will be produced or provided over a period of time or by a specified date. Outputs may be quantitative or qualitative but must be measurable during an assistance agreement project period.

Outputs are required and may include, but are not limited to, the following:

Key metrics such as:

- Number of farmers or farming communities that adopt sustainability and resiliency practices;
- Number of farmers or farming communities that adopt practices that lead to reduced nutrient losses and improved water quality;
- Estimation of nutrient reduction, habitat improvement, and/or sustainable forests protected;
- o Numbers of acres and/or miles of conservation practices adopted; or
- Number of restoration, watershed, and/or land use plans designed, developed, or adopted.
- Farmer to farmer education events/presentations (report number of events and participants) that share the successful outcomes, lessons learned, technologies developed, approaches gleaned, and best practices employed; or
- Number of new sub-watershed wide and/or regional coalitions, partnerships or efforts resulting from investments under this grant award.

Note: Quarterly progress reports and a final project report are additional required outputs.

Outcomes

Environmental outcomes are the result, effect, or consequence that will occur from carrying out an environmental program or activity that is related to an environmental or programmatic goal or objective and are used as a way to gauge a project's performance. Outcomes may be qualitative and environmental, behavioral, health-related, or programmatic in nature, but must also be quantitative. Outcomes may be short term (changes in learning, knowledge, attitude, skills), intermediate (changes in behavior, practice, or decisions), or long-term (changes in condition of the natural resource).

Applicants must demonstrate how their proposed project will achieve the following outcomes/results:

- Change in willingness to adopt practices as a result of project outreach. For example, number of farmers who intend to adopt or are adopting practices as a result of project outreach;
- Improved resiliency of farming operations (climate, financial, etc.);
- At least one of the following:
 - Acres AND Type of habitat enhanced, protected or restored over the life of the project with quarterly milestones clearly reflected. An initial baseline must be included to provide an accurate view of progress OR based on before and after project measurements; or
 - Improvement in at least one water quality (WQ) parameter in a water body and/or segment over the life of the project with quarterly milestones clearly

reflected. An initial baseline must be included to provide an accurate view of progress OR based on before and after project measurements (or best practice WQ monitoring periods). Examples of WQ parameters that could be demonstrated in a WQ improvement project include but are not limited to excess nutrients, turbidity, total suspended solids, dissolved oxygen, pH, and temperature.

Additional outcomes may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Pollutant (e.g., nutrients, sediment, plastics) load reductions in the Gulf of Mexico watershed;
- The number of pounds of nitrogen, phosphorus, or sediment discharge avoided;
- Improvements made to state, county, or local environmental programs, requirements or policies that better protect public health and the environment;
- Improved collective knowledge about more efficient farming practices, resulting in reduction in the pollution in segments of the Gulf of Mexico watershed; or
- Cost savings resulting from project implementation.

Project Performance Measures

The applicant should also develop performance measures they expect to achieve through the proposed activities and describe them in their application. These performance measures will help gather insights and will be the mechanism to track progress concerning successful processes and output and outcome strategies and will provide the basis for developing lessons to inform future recipients. It is expected that the description of performance measures will directly relate to the project outcomes and outputs.

The following are questions to consider when developing output and outcome measures of quantitative and qualitative results:

- What are the measurable short term and long term results the project will achieve?
- How does the plan measure progress in achieving the expected results (including outputs and outcomes)?
- How will the approach use resources effectively and efficiently?

ELIGIBILITY

Eligible Applicants are <u>organizations submitting projects to work directly with producers</u> (farmers and ranchers) from underserved communities and/or directly with underserved <u>producers</u>. In accordance with Assistance Listing 66.475, applications will be accepted from:


State and Local Governments (includes State-Designated Indian Tribes)

- Federally Recognized Indian Tribal Governments
- Intertribal Consortia
- Interstate Agencies
- Public or Private Universities and Colleges
- Public or Private nonprofit institutions (as defined at 2 CFR 200.1)
- Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) and non-profit organizations as defined in 2 C.F.R. § 200 with influence on underserved farmers, socially disadvantaged farmers and/or limited resource farmers, including:
 - Beginning Farmer Organizations
 - Conservation Districts
 - Veteran Farmer or Rancher Groups

Eligible organizations <u>must</u> directly collaborate with underserved farmers on projects within EPA's Ohio-Tennessee Region. The region includes Kentucky and Tennessee; portions of Indiana and Ohio (Mississippi drainage); the western portions of North Carolina, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, and Virginia; and portions of the following counties: Maryland (Garrett County); New York (Allegany, Cattaraugus, and Chautauqua Counties).

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF GRANT APPLICATIONS PER ELIGIBLE JURISDICTION

Eligible entities may submit one pre-application for funding through the NASDA Foundation.

APPLICATION AND PROJECT TIMELINES

All applications must be made through the NASDA Foundation online grant portal which opens March 1, 2023. The application timeline is as follows:

- March 1 April 15, 2023: Grantee Portal open to accept Pre-Applications.
- May 2023: Successful Pre-Applicants will be notified of their eligibility to submit a Full Application.
- May 15 June 15, 2023: (Projected) Grantee Portal will open to accept Full Applications (by invitation only to the highest scoring Pre-Applicants).
- July 15, 2023: Expected Date of Award Announcements.
- August 1, 2023 September 30, 2026: Maximum Grant Performance Period.

AMOUNT OF FUNDING AVAILABLE

More than \$3,000,000 in funding is expected to be awarded for the 2023 NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program. The NASDA Foundation expects to approve up to 16 regional sub-awards, averaging \$125,000 each, with a minimum sub-award threshold of \$75,000 and a maximum of \$225,000.

II. Application Process Details

Applicants to the NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program can expect a two-part application process, with simple electronic submission of the application and required documents.

SIMPLE, WEB-BASED APPLICATION PROCESS

All application documents must be submitted using the NASDA Foundation's web-based Grant Portal, accessed by following the "Access the Grant Portal" link on the grant program website: https://www.nasda.org/epa. Starting March 1, 2023, the grant portal will be posted and open; please register for an account to apply for the grant. The system is designed to allow the application process and reporting for the awarded grantees, to be as simple and efficient as possible.

PRE-APPLICATIONS, ACCEPTED MARCH 1 – APRIL 15, 2023

The Pre-Application phase will focus on a project summary, organizational capability, and a risk assessment of applicants. Pre-Applicants will be evaluated on their ability to:

- Submit projects that meet the goals and requirements of the NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program;
- Have (or have the ability to quickly obtain) a System for Award Management (SAM) number and a Unique Entity Identifier (UEID) see https://sam.gov/content/entity-registration for details;
- Demonstrate prior experience in (or at minimum demonstrate readiness to do so):
 - Managing sub-awards, to including auditing and monitoring of results;
 - Reporting on grant activities on a quarterly basis;
 - Protecting data from cybersecurity issues;
 - Generating and managing Environmental Measurement Data (see https://www.epa.gov/measurements-modeling for additional information); and
 - Developing and implementing an EPA-compliant Quality Assurance Project Plan (see https://www.epa.gov/quality/quality-assurance-project-plan-development-tool for a recently updated QAPP development tool).

FULL APPLICATIONS, BY INVITATION ONLY MAY/JUNE 2023

The highest ranking Pre-Applications will be invited to submit a Full Application, which will include additional detail on the technical aspects of proposed projects. Invited applicants must:

- Submit projects that provide significant benefits to historically underserved farmers, including limited resource, beginning, socially disadvantaged, and veteran farmers; and
- Submit projects that comply with the Clean Water Act Section 104(b)(3).

III. Project Activities

The NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program will fund as many as 16 projects, each with a duration of 1-3 years and with total funding between \$75,000 and \$225,000. Specific activities and required elements for qualified projects are identified below.

PROJECT ACTIVITY EXAMPLES

Proposed projects <u>must include at least one</u> of the following types of activities:

- Water Quality Focused Examples: nutrient reduction with creative runoff treatment solutions; innovative year-round ground cover to limit erosion; planting field buffers; conservation tillage; managing livestock access to streams; address key manure nutrient management issues (e.g., phosphorus saturation in soil, ammonia emissions, alternative uses for manure nutrients); increase the implementation of nitrogen-use efficiency tools to better manage inorganic nitrogen inputs on cropland.
- Habitat Focused Examples: riparian zone improvement; observing environmental
 windows; restoration or protection of wildlife corridors; partner easements;
 landowner habitat planting/restoration; other innovative habitat ideas; conservation
 and restoration of perennially flooded grasslands and forests.
- **Sustainable Forest Management** Examples: utilizing sustainable forestry practices that protect and maintain water quality and habitat; improving utilization of sustainable forestry practices through training, education, and public outreach; and monitoring effectiveness of sustainable practices.

The following are ineligible activities:

- Projects that do not comply with Clean Water Act Section 104(b)(3), which authorizes
 the award of assistance agreements to conduct and promote the coordination and
 acceleration of research, investigations, experiments, training, demonstrations,
 surveys and studies relating to the causes, effects, extent, prevention, reduction, and
 elimination of pollution.
- Actions required to settle a formal enforcement action or included in a court order; or specified as a required mitigation measure under a state, local, or federal permit for a specific project; however, grant funding may be used to enhance or expand such projects beyond minimum requirements for compliance.
- Work involving only routine maintenance of storm water infrastructure and other facilities.

- Projects which fall under the existing planning responsibilities of an individual state or local government (e.g., development of TMDLs or MS4 permits).
- Solely "gray infrastructure" projects (e.g., installation of sewer lines).
- Construction activities that are not a part of a demonstration project. This includes, but is not limited to, preliminary planning to determine the economic and engineering feasibility of a facility; engineering, architectural, legal, fiscal, and economic investigations and studies; surveys, designs, plans, working drawings, specifications, procedures, and other actions necessary to the construction of a facility; the erection, acquisition, alteration, remodeling, improvement, or extension of a facility; and the inspection and supervision of the construction of a facility.

REQUIRED PROJECT ELEMENTS

Proposed projects <u>must also include BOTH</u> of the following required elements:

- Collaboration Examples: partner organizations replicating existing successes in
 watersheds to build stakeholder and farmer capacity through technical trainings and
 outreach, including sub-awards to local farmer organizations to demonstrate
 techniques; working with farmer-led organizations or consortiums to reach out to
 small farms that are having financial, technological or other challenges in adopting
 nutrient reduction practices and develop creative solutions to overcoming those
 barriers; working with farming communities to stand up a farmer-led organization
 that provides technical assistance to farmers.
- Sustainable and Resilient Agricultural Operations Examples: identifying
 vulnerabilities to climate- related risks including understanding potential exposures
 (e.g., weather variability such as drought, flooding, etc.); exploring the social,
 economic, cultural, and technical implementation challenges and opportunities for
 making fundamental changes to the way we farm in the watershed to ensure the
 long- term sustainability of agriculture; developing adaptive capacity or resilience to
 respond, recover and transform continued operations after exposure that will result
 in reduced soil nutrient losses and improved downstream water quality.

PROJECT DURATION AND MAXIMUM TOTAL FUNDING

Projects <u>must</u> be between 1 and 3 years in duration, and organizations may request between \$75,000 and \$225,000 in <u>total</u> project funding.

This program does not require matching funds. Proposed projects can be funded at 100%.

IV. Program Rules, Terms, and Conditions

ALLOWABLE COSTS

Allowable costs include outreach/meeting/technical assistance/training costs, travel costs, registration fees, speaker fees, contractual fees, audiovisual materials, and purchase/rental/maintenance/shipping of supplies and equipment required to support the project.

Indirect costs are permissible for all grant categories based on a signed and current federal cost rate agreement, or at the de minimis rate of 10%. The Office of Management and Budget provides additional guidance on the de minimis rate at:

https://www.ecfr.gov/current/title-2/subtitle-A/chapter-II/part-200/subpart-E/subject-group-ECFRd93f2a98b1f6455/section-200.414 . Indirect costs should be submitted within the budget section of the grant application.

NON-ALLOWABLE COSTS

Certain expenses and costs are not allowable under the NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmer Grant Program. Please note the following restrictions:

- Vehicles: Costs associated with procurement of vehicles are not allowed.
- Construction: Costs for construction and/or remodeling of physical structures are not allowed.
- Food: Expenses for food, snacks, meals, and catering (other than per diem for travelers) are not permitted for any grant.
- Other Agreements, Grants, & Funding Sources: Any expenses reimbursed under other cooperative agreements, grants, contracts, and/or other funding mechanisms must remain distinct and separate from any award of the NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmer Grant Program.
- Promotional items and costs are generally prohibited unless they provide a direct project benefit. Examples of prohibited items: gift bags, logoed items (pens, notepads, shirts, hats), gift cards, etc.

PROGRAM RULES AND REQUIREMENTS

The following rules and requirements apply to the program:

1. For travel requested in any grant, travel costs should adhere to the following general guidelines (contact the NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmer Grants Management Team with specific travel-related questions not covered below):

- a. Receipts are required for all travel expenses except meals, which will be reimbursed on a federal per diem basis (unless your agency has a different and required per diem policy). The General Services Agency (GSA) Meals and Incidental Expenses (M&IE) breakdown may be accessed at http://www.gsa.gov/portal/content/101518.
- b. The prevailing federal per diem rate for the destination will be allowed for meals and incidentals. On travel days (first and last days), in most cases 75% of the federal per diem rate will be reimbursed. We reserve the right to disallow per diem for meals which are provided at no cost to the participant as part of the program.
- c. Hotels will be reimbursed at actual room cost plus any applicable tax during dates of travel and should be booked at the most economical rate practical. Incidental lodging expenses (Internet, etc.) beyond room, parking, and tax will not be reimbursed.
- d. Air travel is to be taken by the most economical domestic fare available. Advance purchase is required. First or business class, "economy plus"-type, or any other upgraded air travel is not authorized. Baggage fees may be reimbursed with a receipt.
- e. Reimbursement for use of a private automobile shall be at the prevailing federal rate, reimbursed for mapped mileage to and from the venue, and shall not exceed the cost of advance purchase air travel to the destination.
- 2. For reasons of security and functionality, jurisdictions are required to complete all grant applications online using a modern, up-to-date browser. We suggest using Chrome, Edge, or any other current browser.
- When completing the online application, character counts include spacing.
- 4. All applications must be made through the online portal by the following deadlines:
 - a. Pre-Application Deadline: April 15, 2023 at 5:59 PM Eastern Time.
 - b. Full Application Deadline (by invitation only): June 15, 2023 (current projection) at 5:59 PM Eastern Time.
- 5. All required fields in each application (including POC, organization, and proposal information) must be clear and complete.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

By applying, your agency has made an assurance that it will comply with all applicable Federal statutes and regulations in effect during the grant period. Awards will be based upon the submitted and approved project applications, and are subject to the following conditions:

- The grantee must complete the full scope of work and all tasks outlined in the approved grant application by the Project End Date entered on the grant application unless a written exception is granted by the NASDA Foundation.
- Proposed projects must meet all of the goals and requirements of EPA's Historically Underserved Farmer to Farmer Grant Program, as outlined in this NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program Grant Guidance.
- Any changes to the scope, tasks, deliverables, or expenses of this project must be approved in advance and in writing by the NASDA Foundation prior to work being modified or completed.
- Quarterly Progress Reports must be submitted through the online grant management portal, with a Final Project Report due no more than 45 days after the Project End Date. As part of the quarterly reporting process, the grantee must provide a full accounting of all expenditures made with funds from this grant award, accompanied by the documentation specified in the *Reporting Requirements* section of this document.
- The grantee must have the ability to protect data from cybersecurity issues.
- This program does not require matching funds. Proposed projects can be funded at 100%.
- Funds from this program may be combined with other programs if there is documentation to show that there is no duplication of funding.
- NASDA Foundation will generally reimburse sub-awardees for eligible expenses on a quarterly basis. If necessary, NASDA Foundation has the capability of advancing up to 50% of a project's costs, with the remainder being reimbursed upon completion of mutually agreed-upon project milestones.

V. Proposal Scoring

PRE-APPLICATION SCORING AND EVALUATION

- 1. Applicants who submit a Pre-Application will receive an automated email notification upon successful submittal. If an automated email is not received upon submission, please check your SPAM email folders. If you cannot find the automated email, please contact the NASDA Foundation Grant Program Support Team at (571) 418-6426 or epagrants@nasda.org before the application deadline.
- 2. Pre-Applications received by the deadline will undergo an administrative review, ensuring that all required fields have been completed, and that the organization and project appear to meet the eligibility criteria for this grant program.
 - a. Pre-Applications which are not in compliance with the Program Rules and Requirements will not move forward.
 - b. Pre-Applications that pass the administrative review will move to the Pre-Application Project and Risk Assessment phases.
 - c. For Pre-Applications requiring minor administrative clarification, applicants will be notified and given the opportunity to provide clarifying information within five (5) business days after the notification.
- 3. Pre-Applications will be evaluated for eligibility and scored by up to three (3) reviewers.
- 4. Pre-Application Project Assessment (maximum of 100 Points) Grant Reviewers will score the Pre-Application on the merits of their proposed project to include:
 - a. Alignment with the goals of this grant program, particularly the extent to which the project will benefit historically underserved farmers, including limited resource, beginning, socially disadvantaged, and veteran farmers. (50 Points)
 - b. Experience of the project lead and other project personnel. (10 Points)
 - c. The extent of proposed collaboration. (10 Points)
 - d. Likelihood that the project will encourage sustainable and resilient agricultural operations. (15 Points)
 - e. Likelihood that the applicant will be able to generate the types of environmental data required by EPA. (15 Points)
- 5. Pre-Application Risk Assessment (High, Medium, or Low Risk) The following questions will be used to complete a risk assessment for all Pre-Applications. Although the rating in this section will not impact the scoring of applications,

concerns identified by the risk assessment questions may lead to additional screening before a sub-award decision is made. Risk assessment factors include:

- a. Experience as a sub-awardee, or plans for overcoming lack of experience in this area.
- b. Experience with government grant reporting, and the ability to report on funded activities on a quarterly basis.
- c. The ability to protect data from cybersecurity issues.
- d. Competency in generating and managing Environmental Measurement Data (see https://www.epa.gov/measurements-modeling for details).
- e. The ability to develop and implement a Quality Assurance Project Plan (see https://www.epa.gov/quality/quality-assurance-project-plan-development-tool).

FULL APPLICATION SCORING AND EVALUATION

- 1. The top-scoring eligible Pre-Applications will be invited to submit a Full Application.
- 2. Full Applications will give invited organizations the opportunity provide additional project details.
- 3. Full Applications will be reviewed by up to (3) reviewers, and scored and ranked according to the following criteria (maximum of 100 Points):
 - a. How the project will benefit historically underserved farmers, including limited resource, beginning, socially disadvantaged, and veteran farmers. (50 Points)
 - b. How the project plan assures compliance with the Clean Water Act Section 104(b)(3). (10 Points)
 - c. The applicant's past performance and project plans for reporting on the required environmental outputs and outcomes. (10 Points)
 - d. The applicant's plans for measuring progress toward achieving the expected outputs and outcomes required for this program. **(15 Points)**
 - e. The extent to which the project helps achieve Goal 5, Objective 5.2 of EPA'S FY 2022-2026 STRATEGIC PLAN: "By September 30, 2026, increase by an additional 41,000 square miles the area of watersheds with surface water meeting standards that previously did not meet standards from the July 7, 2021 baseline." (15 Points)
- 4. The Project Leadership Team (EPA and NASDA Foundation personnel) has discretion when making award decisions and can approve changes to the number of reviewers or reviews, funding amount, priority, project period, and other aspects of sub-awards

to ensure this funding program meets the EPA's intended program goals. Final Award decisions are made by the funder for the grant program (EPA).

- 5. Applications not awarded will be notified via email.
- 6. All awards and declinations are expected to be made by July 31, 2023.

VI. Reporting Requirements

QUARTERLY REPORTING

As with the application process, the NASDA-Foundation Grant Portal will allow web-based reporting, with the goal of keeping the reporting burden low. Reports will be required on a quarterly basis, and will include:

- Collection of data (Outputs, Outcomes),
- Progress reporting (Performance Measures), and
- Requests for funding, either through reimbursement or advance payments.

Grantees must submit quarterly reports through the online grants management portal at https://www.nasda.org/epa.

REIMBURSEMENT AND ADVANCE PAYMENT REQUESTS

Funds are generally awarded on a reimbursement basis when submitted as part of your Quarterly Report, but exceptions may be made based on the needs of the organization (determined on a case-by-case basis). If you need to request an Advance Payment, or have other payment and reimbursement questions, please reach out to the NASDA Foundation Grant Program Support Team at (571) 418-6426 or epagrants@nasda.org.

If the quarterly or final budgets are not as originally projected, list all variances from the original budget and provide a brief explanation for each variance. All changes to the project budget must be submitted in advance of the actual expense via email to epagrants@nasda.org. Note that changes to the original budget submitted with your application are not approved until you receive confirmation via email from the NASDA Foundation.

EXPENSE DOCUMENTATION

When requesting funds, or closing out an Advance Request already received, please use the *NASDA Foundation Grant Program Reimbursement Request Template*, available on the program website as an Excel download, to itemize all expenses for which you are requesting reimbursement. Please also attach copies of all applicable expense documentation for all grant expenses. Attachments can be uploaded in Word, Excel, or PDF.

Expense documentation may include:

- A completed copy of the NASDA Foundation Grant Program Reimbursement Request Template (required – visit the grant program homepage for an Excel Download)
- Receipts
- Invoices marked paid
- Documents to quantify personnel time for employees or contractors, including documentation of:
 - o Time dedicated to the project (timesheets, spreadsheet, etc.); AND
 - Salary / hourly rate of pay (payroll report, signed memo, etc.)
- Mapped documentation of mileage
- If your grant was approved for Indirect Costs in excess of the de minimis rate of 10%, your jurisdiction must have a current and approved cost rate agreement with a Federal agency. If you have not already provided your most recent approved agreement, please attach a scanned PDF copy.
- Any other pertinent information as requested by the NASDA Foundation Grant Program Support Team.

If final expenditures vary from your latest approved budget, you will be required to list variances from the approved budget and provide a brief explanation for each variance. All changes to the project budget must be submitted in advance of the actual expense via email to epagrants@nasda.org. Note that changes to your budget are not approved until you receive confirmation via email from the NASDA Foundation Grant Program Support Team. Approved changes will also be reflected by updates made to your grant, viewable through the grant portal.

Final payment for the remaining amount due for a grant will be made after both a final Reimbursement Request and a Final Project Report are completed and submitted for that grant.

FINAL PROJECT REPORT REQUIREMENTS

A Final Project Report is required for all grants and should document completion of all project deliverables. The Final Report is due no later than 45 days after the end of the project period.

VII. How to Apply for Funding

- 1. Carefully review the details of this Grant Guidance document.
- 2. Gather the required information necessary to answer the questions listed in the *Step-by-Step Application Guidance* (below).
- 3. Confirm that your computer meets the minimum browser requirements to ensure security and functionality with the system. We recommend using Google Chrome, Edge or any of the other current browser to access the online system.
- Complete an online application using the grants management portal at https://www.nasda.org/epa. No more than one application may be submitted by each eligible applicant.
- 5. Submit one (1) application by:
 - a. Pre-Application Deadline: April 15, 2023 at 5:59 PM Eastern Time.
 - b. Full Application Deadline (by invitation only): June 15, 2023 at 5:59 PM Eastern Time.

VIII. Step-by-Step Application Guidance

BEST PRACTICES

The following are a few best practices:

- Many applicants find it helpful to gather the required information into a word processing document, and then cut and paste that information into the grant portal.
 This may be especially helpful if there are Internet connection issues or limited time to access the portal.
- Once you begin to type (or copy and paste) information into the portal, be sure to
 periodically click the "Save" button at the bottom of the screen. After clicking the
 "Save" button, you may log out of the system if necessary, without losing your
 information. Saved applications may be viewed by clicking "Draft Applications" under
 the "Applications" heading in the menu on the left panel of your dashboard.
- An application cannot be submitted until all required fields are complete. Once
 complete, click the "Submit" button at the bottom of the screen. If you inadvertently
 select "Submit" before your application is complete, contact the NASDA FoundationEPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grants Management Team before the
 application submittal deadline to have your application moved back to the "Draft"
 state.

STEP 1 - ELIGIBILITY QUESTIONAIRE

From https://www.nasda.org/epa select the button "Create an Account Now" and take the four question Eligibility Quiz, to ensure your Organization is eligible to receive a grant through this program. Note that individuals and for-profit entities <a href="https://example.com/architestarch

Questions include:

- Do you represent an organization that plans to directly collaborate with producers (farmers and ranchers) from underserved communities and/or directly with underserved producers?
- 2. Is your target population underserved communities and/or producers in EPA's Ohio and Tennessee Region? The states within the Ohio-Tennessee region are Kentucky and Tennessee; portions of Indiana and Ohio (Mississippi drainage); the western portions of North Carolina, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, and Virginia; and portions of the following counties: Maryland (Garrett County); New York (Allegany, Cattaraugus, and Chautauqua Counties).

- 3. Will your proposed project focus on at least one of the following activities: Water Quality, Habitat Preservation/Restoration, or Sustainable Forest Management?
- 4. Will your proposed project be BOTH Collaborative (working with farmers and communities through outreach, technical assistance, and by replicating successful practices) AND focused on Sustainable and Resilient Agricultural Operations?

STEP 2 - ACCOUNT REGISTRATION

Register as a Point of Contact (POC) for your jurisdiction through the NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program grant portal. This step only appears if all answers to the Eligibility Quiz in Step 1 are answered as "Yes."

STEP 3 - RECEIVE YOUR USERNAME AND PASSWORD

Within two (2) business days of registration (but normally sooner, often within 30 minutes) you will receive an email with your username and a password. This email will come to the POC email address entered during registration. Once credentials are received, log into the Grant Portal on the program homepage to begin working on the application.

Be sure to save your username and password, as these credentials will be used after you submit to check the status of your application(s). In some cases, depending on email settings, automated system emails can be sent to a SPAM folder. If you do not receive an email with your Username and Password within two (2) days of registration, please contact the NASDA Foundation Grant Support Team.

STEP 4 - APPLY FOR A GRANT

Complete your Pre-Application by using your username and password to log into the NASDA Foundation-EPA Historically Underserved Farmers Grant Program grant portal at https://www.nasda.org/epa.

Log into the user dashboard in the Grant Portal, and:

1. Navigate to the left menu and click on "Pending Requests."

- 2. Click on the draft application which appears on the right and was automatically created when your registration was approved.
- 3. Go to the top of the application and hit "Edit" to begin the application.
- 4. As you work through the application, go to the bottom of the form and hit "Save" often.
- 5. When you need to take a break from working on your application, hit "Save and Close." Your application will remain accessible and editable until all the required fields are complete and you "Submit."
- 6. Since this is a web-based application, any data entered will not be saved until you click either "Save" or "Save and Close", so save often, especially when you complete an application section or submit a considerable amount of text or other information.

STEP 5 – SAVE AND SUBMIT

Once you have entered all the required information in Steps 3 and 4, carefully review the information you have entered. Click the "Save" button at the bottom of your screen (again, we recommend that you save often during the application process to ensure your work is captured). Note: Saved applications may be accessed by clicking "Pending Requests" on the left panel of your dashboard.

To make changes to a saved application, click the "Edit" button at the top right corner of the screen. Once you have reviewed your application and are confident the information entered into all fields is correct, clear, and complete, click the green "Submit" button in the bottom right corner of your screen to submit your application. A "Note for Submit" box will appear, but it is not required to enter any notes. Click "OK".

Before leaving the Application Portal, allow the screen to refresh (you may have to click on one or more "Update Available" pop-ups), and ensure your application moves from the "Pending Requests" section of the Portal to the "Submitted Requests" section. You should also receive a system generated email confirming the submittal of your application, shortly after it is submitted (if you do not receive a confirming email, please check your email SPAM folder).




