Text of Action Item:

NASDA encourages state feed regulatory programs with regulatory authority over pet food to:

- Swiftly and uniformly adopt the AAFCO Model Regulations for Pet Food and Specialty Pet Food by initiating necessary rulemaking while respecting and recognizing states' individual legal authorities and regulatory processes.
- Work closely with pet food manufacturers and distributors within their state to set goals to achieve full implementation of the regulatory changes within an agreedupon six-year grace period (the period of six years begins from the date of the availability of the printed version of the 2024 AAFCO Official Publication).
- Allow for the sale and distribution of pet food products that are compliant with state
 pet food regulations, or the newly approved regulations (Pet Food Labeling
 Modernization) model rules, by using enforcement discretion in the review of pet
 food labels during the six-year grace period.
